

# 11th Amendment Legislative Subversion of Standing

The Legislative Defendants' 11th Amendment:

*“The judicial power of the United States*

*shall not be construed to extend to any suit in law or equity,*

*commenced or prosecuted against one of the United States*

*by citizens of another state, or by citizens or subjects of any foreign state.”*

This Amendment violates multiple clauses in Our Constitution:

# 11th Amendment Legislative Subversion of Standing

Art 3, Sec 2, Cl 1: *The judicial Power shall extend to all Cases,*

*in Law and Equity, arising under this Constitution, the Laws of the United States, and Treaties made, or which shall be made, under their Authority;*

*-- to Controversies to which the United States shall be a Party;*

*-- to Controversies between two or more States;*

*-- between a State and Citizens of another State;*

Art 3, Sec 2, Cl 2: *In all Cases ... in which a State shall be Party, the supreme Court shall have original Jurisdiction.*

# 11th Amendment Legislative Subversion of Standing

Art 4, Sec 2, Cl 1: *The Citizens of each State shall be entitled to all Privileges and Immunities of Citizens in the several States.*

1<sup>st</sup> Amendment: “Congress shall make no law ... abridging ... the right of the people ... to petition the government for a redress of grievances.”

This Plaintiff exercised his Unalienable Rights to reside in MA and work in CT.

It is self-evident the Legislative Defendants’ 11<sup>th</sup> Amendment

adds residential restriction;

thereby depriving this Plaintiff of his Standing to remedy his perceived losses

from misconduct by the Government of his State of Employment

when he doesn’t live there.
