Why did I receive this notice?

Our records show that you have payments or credits totaling \$200.00 on your 2021 Personal Income Tax account, but we have no record of receiving your tax return for this period.

What should I do?

- Check your records. If you received more than \$8,000.00 in gross income, you are required to file a Personal Income Tax return.
- If you are required to file or are entitled to a refund, send us a signed return complete with all schedules and attachments or submit a return electronically within 30 days.
- If you believe you have already filed, please resubmit your return.
- If you believe this credit does not belong on this account, call us at the number listed below.

What happens if I don't respond?

No response is necessary; however, if we believe that you have a requirement to file a tax return for 2021 we may send you a Notice of Failure to File at a later date. If you have a tax due, interest and penalty will continue to accrue until the balance due is paid in full.

If you are entitled to a refund, you must file a tax return by October 15, 2025 to claim the refund.
