

16th Amendment Overview of Legislative Subversion

Published in OUR globally visible Constitution,

posing as fundamental law,

the Legislative Defendants enacted the 16th Amendment in **1913**;

therein a total of THIRTY words:

“The Congress shall have power to

*lay and collect taxes on incomes, **from whatever source derived,***

***without apportionment** among the several states,*

***and without regard to any census or enumeration.**”*

16th Amendment Overview of Legislative Subversion

Self-evident by their own first 5 words (previously detailed in Allegation 05)

(“*The Congress shall have [doesn’t yet have, but will create more] power ... ”),*

and regardless of the remainder of their sentence,

the Legislative Defendants willfully or ignorantly subverted their limitations

and violated OUR non-expansion mandates

(OUR Const; Art 1, Sec 8, Cl 18; 9th and 10th Amend).
