16th Amendment Overview of Legislative Subversion

Published in OUR globally visible Constitution,

posing as fundamental law,

the Legislative Defendants enacted the 16th Amendment in <u>1913</u>; therein a total of THIRTY words:

"The Congress shall have power to

lay and collect taxes on incomes, from whatever source derived,

without apportionment among the several states,

and without regard to any census or enumeration."

Self-evident by their own first 5 words (previously detailed in Allegation 05)

("The Congress shall have [doesn't yet have, but will create more] power ..."),

and regardless of the remainder of their sentence,

the Legislative Defendants willfully or ignorantly subverted their limitations and violated OUR non-expansion mandates

(OUR Const; Art 1, Sec 8, Cl 18; 9th and 10th Amend).
